The Median is telling the wrong story

The influence of foreclosures and short sales on the housing market is minimal.

<u>Distress</u>: foreclosures and short sales make up only 5% of the overall

It is amazing how often people ask about foreclosures. Buyers want to buy a foreclosure. Investors want to buy foreclosures. Shadow inventory? Empty foreclosures intentionally held off the market? When's the wave?

The reality is that as the interest in distressed homes has grown exponentially, the number of foreclosures and short sales placed on the market has dropped dramatically. Buyers and investors wishes for more distressed sales have become nothing more than wishful thinking. The more they ask, the less they find.

The number of homes placed on the market for the first six weeks of 2014 is up 4% compared to the first six weeks of 2013. That's not a significant change. In digging deeper, the overall makeup of the inventory has changed radically. The number of foreclosures is down 70% and short sales are down 68%. Yet, the number of homeowners with equity placed on the market is up 19%. There are only 260 foreclosures and short sales that were placed onto the market thus far in 2014. Compare that to 828 in 2013 and 2,101 in 2012.

It is pretty safe to say that the change is not a fluke, but a commanding shift in the market. Here's the earth shattering headline to take away from the data: the distressed market, both foreclosures and shorts sales, is down 69% from last year in Orange County.

The trend began a year ago. The year to year drop in comparing 2013 to 2012 was 61%. It was jaw (Continued on page 2)

dropping news a year ago, which illustrates just how impressive this year's drop is in comparison. The distressed tank is running on empty and the fuel light just came on.

Does that mean that distressed homes will vanish? Not hardly. Instead, expect to deal with these low levels for some time. There are still a lot of homes at different stages of the foreclosure process, the infamous "shadow inventory." Collectively, banks have been slow to foreclose and slow to approve short sales. That has been an intentional strategy that, on the surface, has seemed to work surprisingly well. On average, according to Foreclosure Radar, it takes about a year in Orange County for banks to foreclose. Banks are not going to change this strategy anytime soon because it has worked. Unleashing a steady, slow stream of distressed properties has helped reignite the housing market and the overall inventory has dropped substantially from earlier in the downturn.

Now that home values have recovered impressively over the course of the last couple of years, many homeowners who were upside down have been freed from the grip of owing more than their home was worth. As a result, there will be fewer short sales, fewer homeowners walking away from their homes, and, ultimately, fewer foreclosures.

<u>Distressed Breakdown</u>: The distressed last year, but it is gaining momentum just inventory increased by 10 homes in the past as it typically does after the Super Bowl. two weeks.

The distressed inventory, foreclosures and short sales combined, increased by 4%, 10 homes, in the past two weeks and now totals 268. Only 5% of the active listing inventory and 10% of demand is distressed. Compare that to last year when it represented 10% of the inventory and 26% of demand, and two years ago when it represented 33% of the inventory and 56% of demand. As noted earlier, the impact of distressed homes on the overall Orange County real estate market is minimal.

In the past two weeks, the foreclosure inventory increased by 14 homes and now totals 67. 1% of the inventory is a foreclosure. The expected market time for foreclosures is 46 days. The short sale inventory decreased by 4 homes in the past two weeks and now totals 201. The expected market time is 31 days. Short sales represent just 4% of the total active inventory.

Active Inventory: The inventory increased by 4% in the past two weeks.
The inventory added an additional 196

homes in the past two weeks and now totals 5,283. This increase comes despite an increase in demand. Remember, the active inventory does not include pending sales; so, homes are being placed on the market while others are pulled off as they become pending sales. Currently more homes are coming on the market than are coming off. The net result is an increase in the active inventory.

With many homes coming on the market at far reaching, overpriced levels, they will not realize success until they reduce their asking price to the Fair Market Value, what buyers are willing to pay. This is based upon the most recent comparable sales. Buyers do not want to overpay, so they are approaching the market cautiously. Overpriced homes will come on the market and accumulate, causing the inventory to rise.

Last year at this time there were 3,272 homes, 2,011 fewer than today.

<u>Demand</u>: Demand increased by 17% in the past two weeks.

Demand, the number of new pending sales over the past month, increased by 338 and now totals 2,381. Demand will continue to increase and will gain momentum through the Spring Market. Last year demand was at 2,887 pending sales, 506 more than today. Demand may not at the same clip as last year, but it is gaining momentum just as it typically does after the Super Bowl.

For the sellers that price their homes at their Fair Market Values, they are finding success because demand is improving. There are buyers in the marketplace ready to buy at the right price. The expected market time for all homes in Orange County is currently at 67 days, dropping from 75 days just two weeks ago.



- A dripping shutoff valve on your water heater can be fixed by adding an inexpensive garden hose shutoff valve.
- Once silicone caulk is used on a surface, nothing else will stick except more silicone.
 A good test is to try sticking scotch tape to a clean section of the old caulk. If it doesn't stick, more silicone is the only way to go.
- No grout color looks better longer than natural gray. Darker colors tend to lighten when dirty and lighter shades stain easily and show the most dirt.
- Sometimes a coat hanger will clear a drain when a plumbing snake isn't available.
 Straighten the metal, bend a small hook in the end with pliers, and poke it in and out of the drain as far as it will go.
- A 2-liter soda bottle makes an excellent adjustable air pillow to keep your head clean and neck comfortable when working under cabinets and in difficult positions.
- An afghan hook, available at knitting and fabric stores, is the perfect tool for removing hair and other debris from a tub drain with a cover that is tough or impossible to remove.
- If you're stuck in a bind without your favorite penetrating oil, try lemon juice, hydrogen peroxide or kerosene to cut through rust and corrosion.
- A cracked plastic bucket can be repaired with a hot table knife. Heat the knife with a candle and press it against the crack rubbing slowly back and forth until it is
- Toothpaste applied with a damp rag will put the shine back on your hand tools. For really tough deposits, try oven cleaner.
- A 4" section of drinking straw wrapped around your toilet's pull chain will keep the chain from getting caught under the flapper valve.
- Plumbing joints must be completely dry in order to solder them correctly. To stop a trickle of water, roll up a ball of white bread and stuff it deep into the pipe. The bread will hold the water back, but quickly dissolve when you turn the water on.
- A milk jug can help you get a handle on rolled trash bags. Cut a large X in the bottom of the container. Then, thread the first bag through the spout and store the roll inside.
- Natural bristle brooms will last longer if you dip the bristles in a shallow container filled with thinned shellac.
- You can remove rust from small hardware by soaking it overnight in Coco-Cola.
- PVC cement can be used effectively to patch small holes in inflatable toys.

Where's the beef?

What do you do if you've turned vegetarian product of the soya oil industry, TVP is made but still crave the mouth-feel of meat? Susie Chance considers the alternatives :

It's a familiar refrain, 'I could never be a vegetarian, I'd miss the texture of meat.' In fact for those attempting to leave their carnivorous ways behind, there are a surprising number of meat substitutes on the market these days. And many of them happen to be a healthy alternative, too. They may not be everyone's cup of tea, but some

have even been known to fool the most committed meat eaters.... Here we pick out the top contenders.

Quorn™

One of the most popular meat substitutes on the market is Quorn, available both as an ingredient and in a range of Quorn products. Made from a myco-protein derived from the

mushroom family, it's grown using a natural fermentation process, and is then combined with a small amount of egg white and vegetable flavors to help give it the taste and texture of meat. Quorn is low in fat and high in protein and fiber, and readily absorbs flavors in cooking, so works well in stir-fries, curries, casseroles and marinades (see recipe below). You'll find it as an ingredient pre-packed in the chiller cabinet, either as Quorn pieces, which have a delicate chicken-style flavor, or beef-style Quorn mince. Other Quorn products include burgers, fillets and grills, and Quorn Deli Rashers for those with a craving for bacon. Quorn Deli Slices (smoked chicken style, honey roast ham style and turkey and stuffing style) can be added to sandwiches, pizzas and pasta.

TVP or textured vegetable protein, was one of first meat analogue products to emerge, over 30 years ago. Then and now it is often used by the food industry in vegetarian and non-vegetarian food products, but can also be bought in ingredient form from health food stores and supermarkets and is often called dried soya mince. A by-

from the remaining soya flour once the oil has been extracted. Very low in fat and a good source of fiber, it comes as dried chunks, mince or flakes, to which you add water before using in a recipe. There's no flavor to it, but its sponge like texture means it marinates and absorbs flavors well in cooking, and it does have a realistic meat-like texture, especially in traditional mince dishes such as lasagnas and spaghetti Bolognese..

VegeMince

Another popular mince-style ingredient is Realeat VegeMince, made from a combination of rehydrated wheat and soya protein. This one comes frozen in a re-sealable bag and is already precooked with other flavoring ingredients, so you can add it straight to your recipe directly from the freezer. VegeMince takes up its own weight of water or stock when

cooked and has a surprisingly meaty taste and texture. Another good source of protein, it's also suitable for vegans. Also in the range are VegeSteak and VegeBacon.

Tofu isn't really a meat equivalent because it in no way resembles meat in taste or texture. But it is widely used instead of meat in dishes such as stir-fries, and deserves a mention for its nutritional value – it's high in protein and is a good source of calcium, iron and vitamins B1, B2 and B3.

Tofu, sometimes called soya cheese, is actually soya bean curd made from coagulated soya milk, which has been pressed. Its texture depends on how much liquid has been removed. You can buy it chilled as silken tofu, which is creamy and soft and often used in dips, sauces and sweet recipes or as a firmer tofu which comes plain, smoked or marinated. The firmer tofu can be diced or chopped and fried, added to casseroles and salad recipes. It is perhaps best added to stirfries. If possible, marinate cubes of tofu first before adding to your wok

GoodBite

A new kid on the block, GoodBite is about hit our supermarket shelves any day. Already on the market in Holland, GoodBite is made from pea and wheat protein, and the makers claim it has a firm bite and a structure resembling that of chicken. In fact, when you buy it as an ingredient, the pieces are naturally shaped to enhance the resemblance to meat. It's low in fat at around 3%, contains around 25% protein and is as rich in iron and vitamin B as meat. It's also suitable for vegans.

Like some of the other meat 'equivalents', Good-Bite doesn't have much flavor, and is best used in recipes, treated as you would any other meat. You'll find it chilled and in frozen form, as chicken or beef pieces, or added to ready meals.
